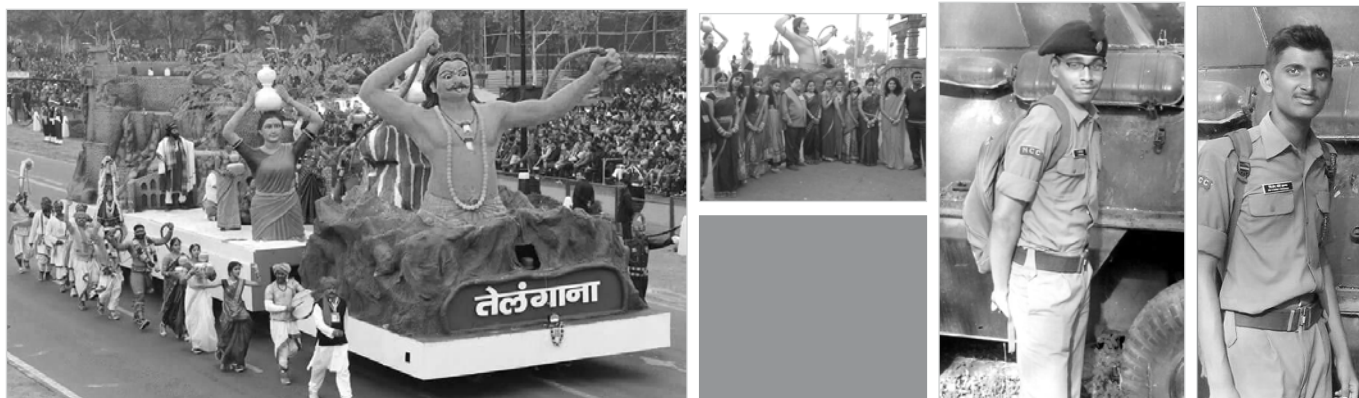

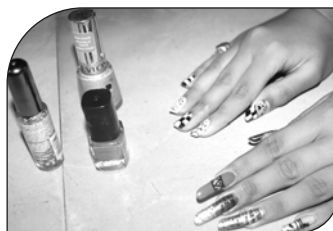
Abhiyaan

Interstellar

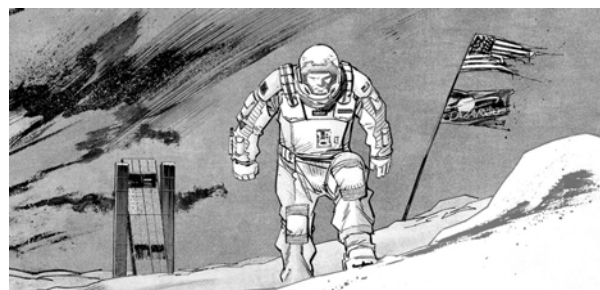
Christopher Nolan

Interstellar is the latest installment in what has been jocularly termed as Nolan's "IN" trilogy, after "Insomnia" and "Inception", to follow his Dark Knight Trilogy. Set sometime in the future, an unexplained off-screen event has turned the world into a dystopian world without technology in which children are encouraged to become farmers rather than doctors or engineers. The story follows one such farmer, Cooper, who was an accomplished NASA pilot earlier in his life, who lives with his inquisitive daughter Murph. Following a cryptic message from an unknown source, they end up driving to a secret NASA facility. There, they learn that the Earth will soon cease to be habitable and mankind must search for a new home elsewhere in the universe. Accompanied by anthropomorphic robots with adjustable sense of humor setting, Cooper sets off on an interstellar journey with scientist Amelia Brand to survey three planets orbiting a blackhole which are thought to be suitable for life.

What is supposed to be a routine spaceflight turns into an emotional rollercoaster, as orbiting a blackhole means that time slows down relative to Earth, meaning that Cooper's family back home ages faster than Cooper. The remainder of the film is about Cooper's struggle to cope with his emotions, betrayal from his crew and his final last ditch attempt to save mankind.

Releasing exactly one year after what has been acclaimed as the best space movie ever, Gravity, Interstellar had a lofty target to reach. Visually, Interstellar is as grand as Gravity or any other film before it. But emotionally, the plot falls a bit flat, because it is hard to believe the very elite of the human race, the scientists and the astronauts, can resort to petty bickering while trying to save the human race billions and billions of miles away from Earth. The science is also a bit difficult to wrap one's head around, as time dilation is not exactly a familiar concept



for the masses. As a science student I did not have much trouble understanding the film, especially its climax, but I did spot many a befuddled mind coming out of the theatre which takes away from the visual spectacle they just witnessed.

Matthew McConaughey as Cooper delivers what's expected of him, he is especially poignant in scenes involving his daughter. Anne Hathaway as Amelia Brand hams a lot, which gets irritating after sometime. Jessica Chastain as the grown up Murph steals the show; one can only imagine how much better the movie would have been if she had got more screen time.

Interstellar is definitely Christopher Nolan's magnum opus, but he had a bit too much on his plate. What could have been the seminal science fiction thriller of our time ended up as a half baked emotional drama with a bit of science. It is a must watch, preferably on an IMAX screen, for its sheer visual grandeur, but do not expect to walk out of the theatre completely satisfied.

However, when Leia is captured by the imperial army, it is up to the droids, R2-D2 and C-3PO, to find Obi-Wan. A series of circumstances leads the droids to Luke Skywalker, a young boy living an ordinary life with his uncle and aunt. Fascinated by the story of the droids, Luke meets the mysterious hermit, Ben, to know more about the situation. With stormtroopers looking for the droids, Luke and Ben enlist the help of the smuggler Han Solo. Who is Obi-Wan? Will Luke escape the clutches of the Empire? Will the rebels be able to stop the Death Star in time? What follows is an unforgettable space opera.

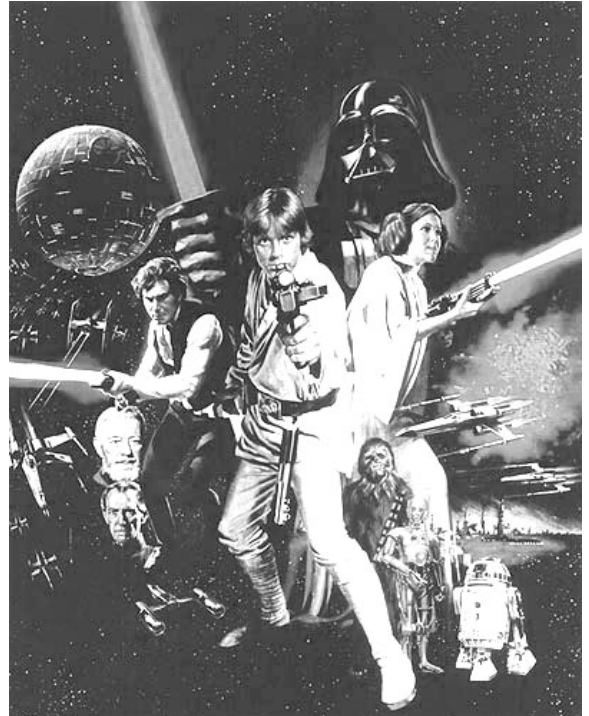
Written and directed by George Lucas, Star Wars is a world full of adventure and excitement. It uses sci-fi as a backdrop and focuses on the fantasy elements and relatable characters. The story focuses on the all important events that occur in the lives of the characters. This keeps the audience engaged while also offering them an expansive and creative world. The notion of the Force, an energy field within and around all living beings, intrigues us. The mystical Force plays a major role in the story, and helps us see the film in a new light. The fact that both good guys and bad guys can use it creates a sense of excitement and fear. Lucas enthralled the audience through innovative characters such as the Jedi, Stormtroopers,

droids, Wookies and other alien races. The strength of the movie lies in the way the lead characters are used. Archetypes from our bedtime stories and folklore are placed in an extra-ordinary environment. The farm boy who yearns for adventure, the princess who is willing to do anything to save her people and the reluctant hero pirate who rises up to the occasion. Lucas writes them in such a way that the audience never loses connection with them. We believe that they are real people and they guide us through the story. We spend enough time with Luke to understand his plight, his hopes and dreams. We feel his frustration and sadness. The slow build-up adds depth and emotion, and anticipation for the story to expand. The obstacles and struggles our heroes deal with are visceral and terrifying. The drama in the film is the result of us rooting for them against the opposition. It is satisfying to watch them on their heroic journey- a proper arc. The lovable underdogs are up against the big bad and the writing gives equal importance to both sides. Lucas' smart script and writing give us some of the best dialogue and non-dialogue moments. The movie is packed with memorable dialogues such as "Remember, the Force will be with you, always." and "Great shot, kid. That was one in a million.", and also powerful scenes with no dialogue requirement such as Luke staring at the horizon and Darth Vader displaying the power of the force. Even little things like the kind-hearted Luke's sarcastic reaction to the droids, his interactions with the Sand People and the Jawas, his visit to the Mos Eisley cantina, Han's dismissal of the Force and the interactions of the rebel fighters- all give us the sense of being in a real world full of believable creatures with different ideologies. By mixing up all these elements, Lucas gives us a well-fleshed out epic.

The performances of all the actors are commendable. Mark Hamill gives us a believable hero through his amazing portrayal of the wide-eyed Luke. Carrie Fisher, with her dry humour, excels as the brave and no-nonsense Leia and never comes off as a damsel in distress. Acclaimed British thespian Sir Alec Guinness gives us an outstanding performance as Luke's mysterious and witty spiritual mentor Ben. Peter Cushing does a phenomenal job as the ruthless villain, Tarkin. Anthony Daniels shines as the bumbling sidekick, C-3PO. His interactions with R2-

D2 provide the comic relief. The breakout roles are, of course, Harrison Ford as the smug Han Solo and James Earl Jones as the voice of the menacing Darth Vader (portrayed by David Prowse). Han Solo is a dashing and smarmy thief with the heart of gold. The sarcastic, snappy and laid-back attitude of Han makes him more charming than the others. Ford is terrific as the roguish and arrogant Han. His spot-on comedic timing is also utilized well, giving us memorable lines such as, "Great, kid! Don't get cocky" and "You know, sometimes I amaze even myself". James Earl Jones' rich baritone is effectively used for the horrifying Darth Vader. From his first appearance, Vader intimidates us. His fearsome armor, unsettling breathing and cold-blooded attitude make him a strong enemy for our heroes. Jones' commanding voice makes Vader one of the best movie villains of all time. Lines such as, "I find your lack of faith disturbing" and "The Force is strong with this one" have a permanent place in history because of Jones. The crackling chemistry and banter between Hamill, Fisher and Ford provide ample entertainment.

Lucas does a praise-worthy job of creating the world of Star Wars. He should also be commended for his creative choices as a director. The initial explosion of music, the opening crawl and the opening shot of a gigantic imperial ship, Star Destroyer, chasing a smaller rebel ship immediately capture our attention. These are not used as a gimmick, since they inform us about the film's scope and back-story, avoiding clunky expository scenes. The low angle opening shot implies dominance and the length of the Star Destroyer implies the long reach of the empire. We know everything we need to just from the visuals. Scenes, though set in a different world, are very simplistic for everyone to follow. It is a testament to Lucas' passion and ingenuity that the fantasy world never feels boring and fake. The ground-breaking visual effects give us the fantastic yet realistic Millennium Falcon, lightsabers, blasters and the X-wing Star fighters. The use of practical effects, puppets, models and real sets give the movie a unique visual aesthetic and never feels out-dated. All this was accomplished without the wonders of modern CGI. John Williams' iconic score stays with you forever. It is never cold and futuristic, given the setting. The music is



always heroic, emotional and imperial. The impact of several scenes is amplified infinitely by unforgettable themes composed by Williams.

Star Wars is an incredible movie. It is the modern day homage to classic adventure stories of the past. Good guys fighting bad guys, the classic hero on a journey, the adventurous rogue, a bad guy whose motivation is clear, the wise old sage- all in an epic quest of discovery. The strong characters and the sci-fi setting make Star Wars a refreshingly grand experience. Star Wars succeeds in giving us a good mix of light-hearted fun and seriousness. It is one of the most quotable and rewatchable movies of all time. From the explosive beginning to the spectacular ending, everything stays with you and you walk out with a smile, feeling complete. It had transformed a generation of moviegoers and continues to show its influence even today. Watch it to have an exciting and unbelievable cinematic experience.

It speaks more of integrity...nineteenth century feminism... and a love that is blatantly truthful, and for want of a euphemism- 'pure!'

Jane Eyre. Possibly one of the finest classics in time. This is not just a romance novel. It speaks more of integrity...nineteenth century feminism... and a love that is blatantly truthful, and for want of a euphemism- 'pure!' In the midst of complex emotions and trying situations in the book, the passionate love between Mr Rochester and Jane gleams in relief.

Jane Eyre is an orphan with little social standing, who is taken in by her relatives, the Reeds. They are cruel and deceitful to young Jane, and send her off to the Lowood Charity School when she is old enough. The living conditions there are horrible; the food is foul, the teachers are harsh, epidemics spread, causing several deaths. She loses her best friend, Helen Burns, and becomes as much a recluse as ever. When conditions at Lowood improve, she stays on as a teacher until she is eighteen, and then accepts a position as governess to a young French girl, Adele Varens, the ward of the owner of Thornsfield hall, Edward Rochester.

Jane's character is gilded with integrity and inner strength. Though there is hardly ever a smile on her face, her dreams are boundless, and her solitude gives her peace. "I care for myself. The more solitary, the more friendless, the more unsustained I am, the more I will respect myself," she says.

Mr Rochester, is a dark, brooding man, with a lot of secrets. He lives in a seemingly haunted house, where Jane hears murmurs and laughter at night. Jane and Rochester slowly get to know each other and she falls passionately in love with him. Certain that he would not marry a plain girl like her, she assumes he will ask for the beautiful Blanche Ingham's hand; but to her surprise, Mr Rochester asks her to marry him. Lowering her staunch reserve for once, she agrees and the wedding day approaches.



The wedding ceremony is however interrupted by a man accusing Rochester to have a living wife, Bertha Mason; the mad woman in the attic of Thornsfield Hall. Jane is shattered, and refuses to yield to Rochester's repeated requests of marriage. He wasn't told of Bertha's illness before marriage, and divorce was hard to obtain later. So he kept her in the attic as an act of kindness against sending her away to the cruel conditions of a mad house. Jane, however much in love with him, will not break the laws of God. She leaves Thornsfield, and is taken in by her relatives, the Rivers. She is eventually courted by St. John Rivers, a devout clergyman, but with Jane's heart still tied to Mr Rochester, she denies the proposal. Then one day, she hears the voice of Rochester calling her, and she returns to Thornsfield hall...

There are very few books that are as powerful as Jane Eyre. Both Jane and Rochester's characters are hard hitting, and are bound to leave a profound impact on the reader. While Jane's love is tempered with veracity, Mr Rochester is all manly and sensible. Despite he not disclosing his story with Bertha and his supposed child out of wedlock, Adele, his nature cannot be considered as arrogant or misleading. Jane's love is justified, and Mr Rochester is bound to become a wistful knight-in-shining-armor to readers (of the fairer sex of course).

There are several movie adaptations and many alternate writings in all sorts of genres of this book; but the original work of Charlotte Bronte remains what it is; a classic.

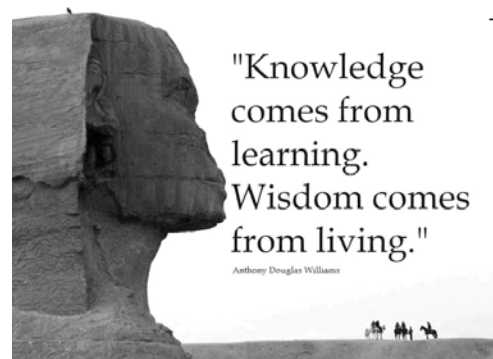

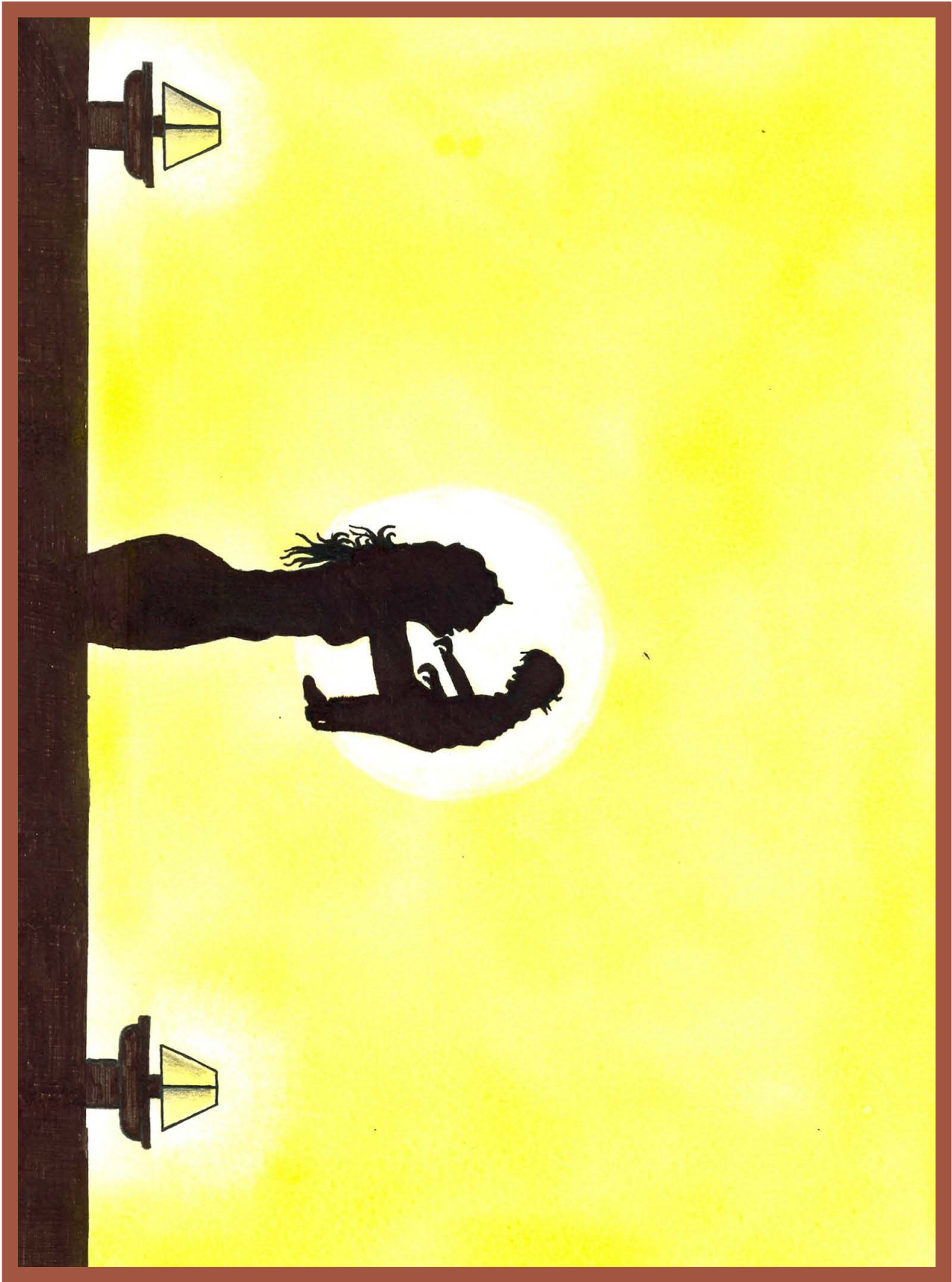
