Impact of GST on Indian Economy

Goods and Services Tax (GST) is the biggest tax reform in India till date. It is a single tax on a product or service replacing the multiple tax system. In the short run GST may have glitches but in the long run it will definitely boost the economy. GST is an international tax regime. More than 160 countries already implemented GST.

In every aspect of life there will be positive as well as negative effects. GST too has its positives and negatives.

Some of the Positive Impacts are:

- 1) As there will be no interstate tax, transport of goods will be much easier. This will benefit transport industry and suppliers of goods as well. This leads to improve business efficiency which in turn helps improving economy.
- 2) With the elimination of interstate tax, more goods will be imported and exported among states. This leads to improved business and hence improves economy.
- 3) With the tax benefits GST provides, the price of goods will reduce in the long run. This will increase consumerism and hence improves economy.

Some of the Negative impacts are:

- 1) Smuggled goods may travel freely throughout the country once they cross the border, because of no separate

checking at inter-state borders. If this happens it will impact the Indian economy negatively.

- 2) Prices of goods that are bought by upper middle class and upper class are increased. This may deter them from buying such kind of products. This will lead to decreased demand, decreased production, and will have negative impact on economy.
- 3) With the increased competition of goods from other states, local people may feel discriminated. This may lead to lesser quality products to cope up with the competition.

GST is a step in the right direction and removes unwanted intermediaries. Though it may affect us in the short run it will be beneficial in the long run.

Thermal Hacking

Every one knows about Hacking. It is an attempt to exploit a computer system or a private network inside a computer. Simply put, it is the unauthorised access to, or control over computer network security systems for some illicit purpose.



Recently HARVARD UNIVERSITY has given a report on Thermal hacking through their researches. Nowadays people use systems for many purposes and our system has a mechanised technical way to cool down as Computers produce varying levels of heat depending on how much processing they're doing. In addition to the CPU, the graphics-processing unit and other motherboard components produce significant heat as well. A system that is simultaneously streaming video, downloading files and surfing the internet will consume a lot of power and generate heat.

To monitor the temperature, computers have a number of built-in thermal sensors to detect heat fluctuations and trigger an internal fan to cool the system off when necessary or even shut it down to avoid damage.

Hackers use these thermal sensors to get highly confidential information which are even stored in Air Gapped Systems(The systems which are used by the Army and other confidential software companies, where these systems are neither connected to internet nor to any other

devices only information is passed only through physical devices). The hackers work through the thermal sensors and translate the different levels of temperature into Binary language "1" and "0".

Thermal Camera Hacking

Most of the World has been using the net transactions and this is supported and introduced by the govt so as to reduce and eliminate black money but as, we are using devices for transactions using passcodes to access our bank accounts some people are watching us BE CAREFULL....!!! The Star of the Month

Paloji Tejaswini Winner of Two successful Guinness World Records and High Range Book of Records.

Paloji Tejaswini of B.Com. IIA started her career in karate when she was 5 years old. Her father, Paloji Praveen Kumar, who is VI Dan Black Belt is her guide mentor and coach. She has participated in various tournaments and achieved various awards in the Under 13 category. She lost her 1st International Tournament when she was 11 years old, but she never lost her hope and with grim determination contested for the International Championship in the Under 13 category which was held at Coimbatore. She bagged the 1st place in Katas and 2nd place in Sparring competitions. At the age of 11 she won many National and International tournaments and later discontinued her training for some years.

Tejaswini resumed her training at the age of 16 and with sheer determination she went after her new targets—to achieve world records. Every day she practiced for 2 hrs in the morning and 2 hrs in the evening. With her father's motivation, training and sheer dedication she achieved two successful Guinness World Records and High Range Book of Records by successfully doing non-stop full contact kicks i.e. 1790 kicks for 1 hour. The event was held at Patancheruvu on 26th Jan, 2018. A total of 500 members participated and only 40 could make it and Tejaswini was one among them. She achieved her 2nd Guinness World Record at T.K.R. College on 30th April, 2018 by doing non-stop Kumthi (katas) for 1 hour. She is also a Brown Belt holder.

Her success story conveys to us a valuable message-- never to give up in life. "Failures are stepping stones to success". So one should work



hard and should have 3Ds in life to achieve his/her goal. The 3Ds are Dedication, Determination and Discipline.



Movie Review

SANJU

Sanju: A Great film but a not- so -great Biopic.

Watching Sanju was a roller-coaster ride of emotions and humour. Well, every Rajkumar Hirani film is. His ability to mix humour and emotions have gained notoriety and has made him the undisputed king of box office. He's yet to give a film which isn't a blockbuster, so that's the testament to his appeal among the general audiences who just adore his films.

So now comes Sanju, his first film after the 2013 blockbuster, PK, which starred Aamir Khan and the subject of his current film is Sanjay Dutt in prominent roles. Sanju in many ways is just like every other Hirani movie as they have his usual ingredients of placing humour in the most tense of situations. But here is where Hirani also falters as the humor doesn't really work in some places and it is just isn't required in other places.

When watching a biopic set in the bygone eras we do expect some authentic production design but we seldom get any in Sanju. There's absolutely no effort seen in recreating the 80's and 90's in which most of the movie is set. Watching the scenes set in the present and in the past gives you the same experience, a major flaw for a major film like this. This is where the Telugu Biopic "Mahanati" shined as it managed to create a wonderful atmosphere which took you back to the era of the 70's.

Also many important aspects of Dutt's life has been entirely ignored, most importantly his first 2 marriages and his daughter. Similarly, his



friendship with underworld gangster Abu Salem also just gets a passing mention and no concrete screen time. These elements would have made the drama and conflict even stronger.

Now these factors made this a not- so -great biopic but there are lot of aspects which make it a great film.

It's the performances which manages to amaze you. Ranbir completely immerses himself in the role of Dutt and gives a fully committed performance which doesn't border on being a caricature. Vicky Kaushal as his friend Kamlesh, gives a terrific performance and surprisingly even manages to overshadow Ranbir in a few scenes. His gujrati accent is spot on and sounds quite authentic. Paresh Rawal and Manisha Koirala as legendary figures Sunil Dutt and Nargis Dutt respectively are great in their roles.

The father son relationship shown in the movie manages to touch our heart strings and makes us shed a few tears in some moments of pure brilliance. The friendship angle in the movie is definitely giving us some major friendship goals.

The humor works in many places but as I mentioned earlier it just wasn't needed in most of the scenes.

Let's assume Sanju was a fictional movie based on a fictional character. If it was so, then Sanju is an outstanding film but it's not. It's based on one of the most controversial movie stars our country has seen and his life is an open book. But the movie doesn't rise above the surface level and shows us nothing which we don't know. It is thoroughly entertaining but doesn't give us anything new or even remotely shocking. The biggest irony appears in the first scene itself, where we see Sanju Baba thrashing a writer who had written his biography for comparing him to Gandhi! Well, didn't just that seem like an effort to show how Baba is such a great person and doesn't like himself being compared to the Bapu of our nation. The movie makes us utter "Wah, Baba Kya Aadmi Hai!" in the first scene itself.

As expected the movie has turned out to be an all time blockbuster but simply put, it just isn't daring enough to actually question the wrong decisions made by its protagonist who also happens to be the best buddy of this film's writer, director and producer. Let's call this movie a great image cleaner for it's source material.

Book Review

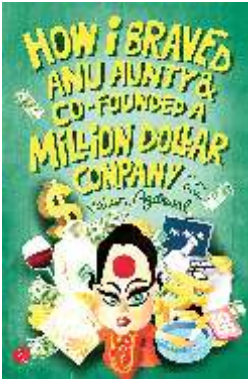
How I Braved Anu Aunty and Co-Founded A Million Dollar Company

"How I Braved Anu Aunty and Co-Founded a Million Dollar Company" is a novel written by Varun Agarwal. This is a true story of Varun Agarwal, a 20-something Bangalore based boy, fresh out of college, an engineering graduate looking for a job but doesn't really know what he has to do in life. As the line from the book goes, "It's the mother of all swears – mother swear!", it is surely the mother of all entrepreneurial beginnings.

This book can be called an autobiography of Varun Agarwal. The charm of this book lies in its sheer simplicity and its engaging style in which the author captures the attention of the readers. 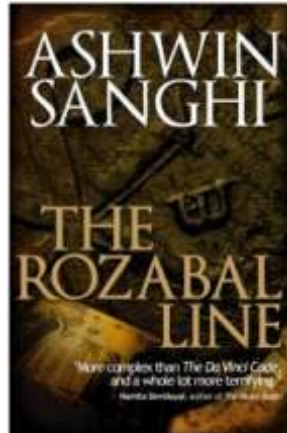
The Rozabal Line

The Rozabal Line is a thriller fiction novel by Ashwin Sanghi written under pseudonym Shawn Haigins. The fictional element is almost similar to Dan Brown's The Da Vinci Code. The book was published on 24th September 2007 in US and on 10th November 2008 in India. The novel became the best selling one and stayed in Best Seller List for several months. The book is also being converted into a screenplay.

Ashwin Sanghi is an Indian writer in the thriller fiction genre. He is the author of three bestselling novels: The Rozabal Line, Chanakya's Chant and The Krishna Key. All his books have been based on historical, theological and mythological themes. Sanghi is an entrepreneur by profession. He is one of the bestselling conspiracy fiction writers.

The story opens with a lady opening a wooden box but faints as soon as she opens it. An assassin swears she'll eliminate anyone who refuses to believe in her twisted credo. The fate of an elite army of thirteen men eerily resembles the fate of Jesus Christ and his disciples. An American priest constantly has disturbing dreams about his past life. A Hindu astrologer, with the help of the position of stars and planets, declares that the world will end soon. In Tibet, a group of Buddhist monks go on a search for reincarnation in a way their ancestors searched for Judea for the Son of God. In Kashmir a tomb named Rozabal holds the riddle which starts in Jerusalem and ends at Vaishno Devi.

Coming to the analysis of the novel it's a blend of history, fiction and mythology. Each character in the story, though belongs to different parts of the world end up in the same place in search of secrets which change the fate of their lives.



Each chapter in the book briefly talks about the lives of the people and how unknowingly their life changes. From the point they all reach Kashmir, that's the part where the real story starts. Each character in the book has their own share of troubled past which made them the way they are at present.

From start to end, each chapter ends suspiciously and mysteriously. The reader, until the last page of the novel, is left clueless but the climax for sure will blow the reader's mind. Every page has unexpected twists and turns which makes the book even more interesting and nail-biting.

These days not many people show interest in history because people label it as a boring subject. What makes the novel so famous and loved by everyone is the blending of thriller and history. 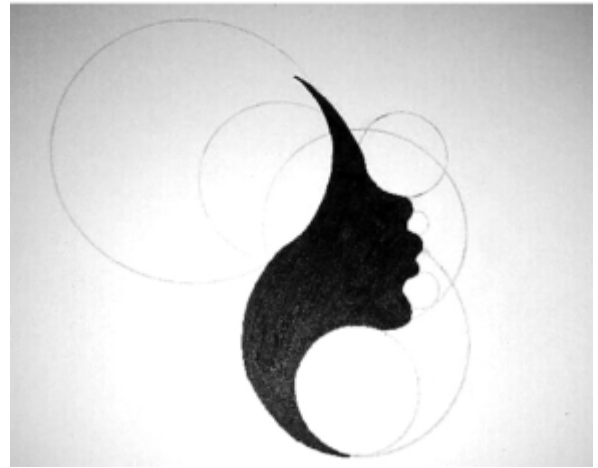
